## **Annual General Meeting**

The Annual General Meeting of Clonown Community Centre Committee will be held on Tuesday 3 March 2009 in the community centre at 8.30 pm. All are welcome.

### **Hall Expenses**

It has been estimated by the committee that the running of the community centre will be approximately €2 000 per annum. The main expenses are insurance, oil and electricity. It is hoped that this money will be raised through fees charged for the use of the hall and by fundraising activities. There will be further information in future newsletters about the fundraising activities, which are planned to be enjoyed by all sections of the community.

# **Charges for the use of the Community Centre**

### **Sports Grant**

The department will pay 80 per cent of the cost (€5000) and the committee the remaining 20 per cent (€1250). As government money is becoming scarcer we are lucky to have got the go ahead.
