Launch of Clonown Community Site Project

Part of the land that was purchased by Roscommon County Council from the late Pat Hynes for the graveyard extension is being made available to the Clonown community. As a result of negotiations between a local committee, Roscommon County Council and local councillors, the land can now be obtained, at a significant reduced price of €35,000

A plan has been drawn up for its use, which will include a lighted walking track, children's play area, a playing field for sports and an option for further development which could include a shop, crèche and the hosting of local sports events.

This project was launched in the community centre recently by the Chairman of Roscommon County Council, Tony Ward. There was a large attendance at the launch, which included local councillors.
