Review of 2015

It may appear to some that little happened in Clonown in 2015. Yet, looking back through the newsletters of the past year it is obvious that Clonown was an active community, with lots of people taking part in many events.

The 5/10 k Fun Run was a huge success and the Welly Walk organised by the children in the school was a great fun event. The Community Field has been used by Clonown Rovers Soccer Club and the Drum/Clonown Community Games committee. Perhaps the most used part of the field is the walking track. Being floodlit during the winter months it facilitated walkers and runners, particularly when several of the roads were flooded.

The church celebrated its Golden Jubilee in June. Bishop Kevin Doran presided at the Jubilee Mass and many Clonown people returned for the occasion. There was a display of photographs of the church opening in 1965 and a party was held for everybody in the community centre after Mass.

There were many successes, also. Keep Fit, Running and Pilates classes were held. There were various fund raisers including a table quiz, bag packing, cake sales and social nights. Restoration of the *Cillín* or unbaptised babies burial ground was completed. A memorial plaque will be erected shortly.

The school children reported on their activities each month. They visited Ericssons, the town library, Athlone castle, the National Concert Hall and went on school tours. Also, members of the Defence Forces visited the

school and presented the children with a copy of the Proclamation and the Irish flag in preparation for the 1916 celebrations.

There were happy and sad occasions. We welcomed two new babies and there were four marriages. There was widespread sadness at the deaths of Kathleen Ward, Patsy Dunning, Lil Ward and Bridget Hardiman.

Finally, a special word of thanks to all the community members who volunteered for and who supported the various activities during 2015.
