Clonown Highlighted on RTE

On Saturday 9 January at 8 am, *Countrywide* was broadcast live from Clonown Community Centre. This programme focused on the problems connected with the recent bad flooding in the area. Maura Shine spoke to Damien O'Reilly, the programme presenter. She described how houses that were built on higher ground after the 1954 flood are now flooded. She also spoke about the hardship suffered by people over several weeks, particularly over the Christmas period. One of the interpretations of the name Clonown is *Cluain Abhann* which means 'meadow of the river' Maura explained that a more apt meaning should be 'meadow in the river!' Others who contributed to the programme were Tom Turley (IFA), TDs Denis Naughton, Gabrielle McFadden and Michael Fitzgerald, representatives from An Taisce and Bird Watch Ireland and Brendan and Emile Shine who finished up the programme with a song. A number of local people were also present. Afterwards, everybody was treated to tea and toasted sandwiches.
